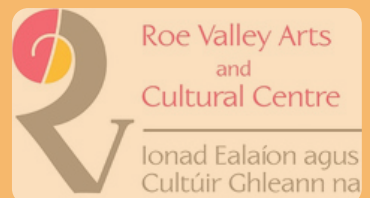
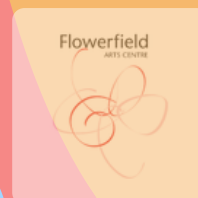

Teaspoon/ stick

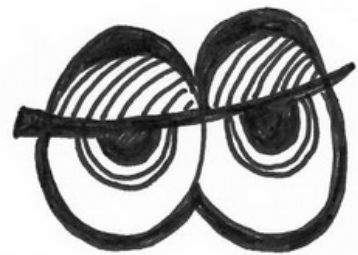
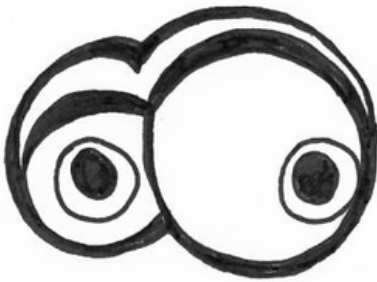
Try making an

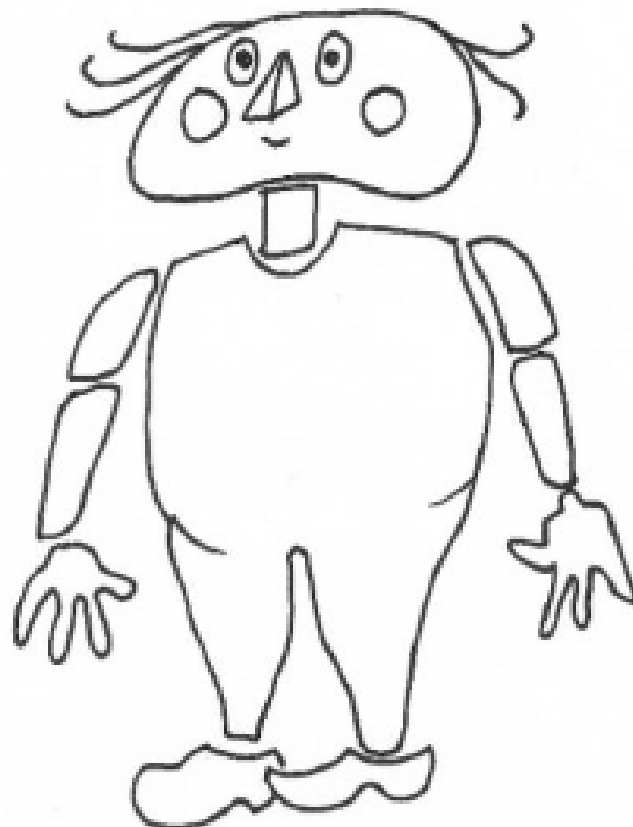
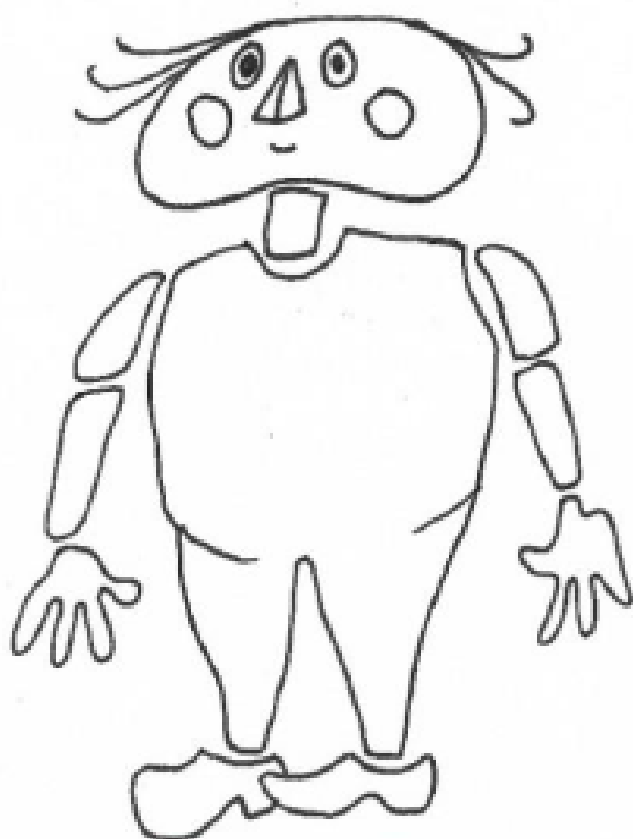
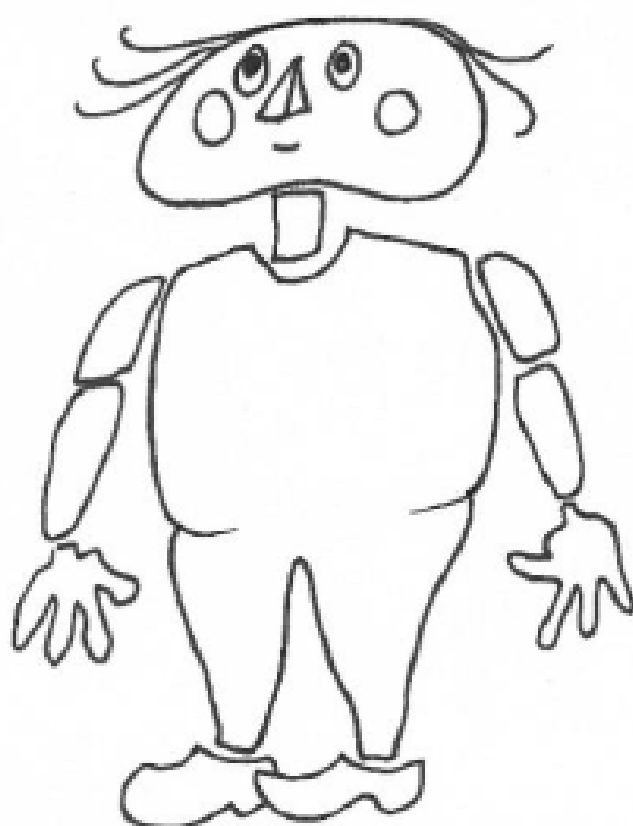
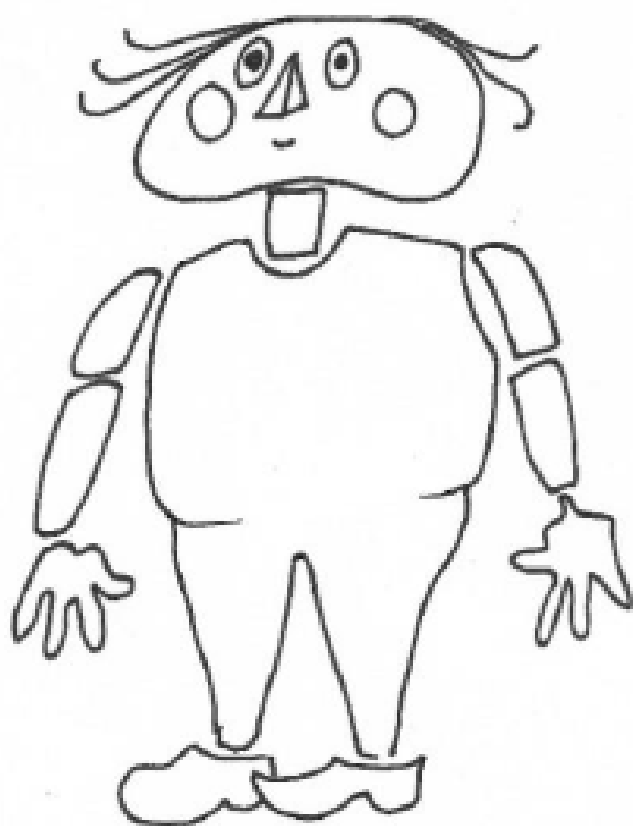
The EMPEROR'S NEW CLOTHES

Create an egg carton

Materials you will need:-

- 3 Large egg cartons
- A sheet of cardboard
- A pair of scissors
- A hot glue gun or doubled sided tape
- Acrylic or poster paints
- Some circle dinner plates
- A pencil

How to make

Cut the egg cartons into different flower shapes. Be as creative as you like at this point! The pointy narrow sections can be used to make thin flowers or the daffodil trumpets. The lids of the egg carton boxes, can be used to cut the leaves from.

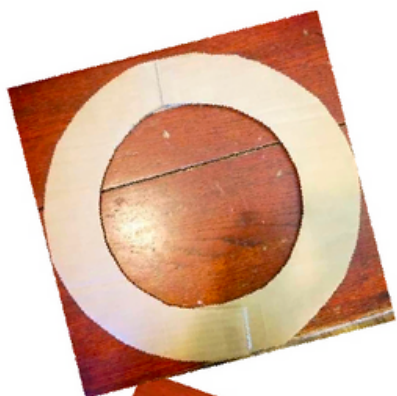

After all your flower shapes are cut, it's time to paint them. First paint them a base colour and let them dry. Decide what decoration or colour you want on top. The extra detail of dots or stripes, really bring the flowers to life.

Create an egg carton *Spring flower* Wreath

3 To make your wreath base, use some plates to trace around on your cardboard and then cut them out. If you have a thin card you can double up with two sheets to make it thicker. Once your wreath base is cut out, paint it green and leave to dry. Also cut out your leaf shapes and paint them green and leave to dry.



4 Using either your hot glue gun (with adult supervision) or double sided tape, or scelotape rolled around in a circle, (to be sticky on the outside) glue your leaves onto the wreath base randomly, leaving them sticking out over the edges.



5 Once the leaves are glued you can start to glue on the flowers. Try to space the colours out. In nature, nothing is perfect and the imperfections themselves are beautiful!



6 Secure a piece of ribbon to the back of your wreath and hand your wreath on a door, wall or window

Enjoy creating your unique masterpiece !!!

Shadow Puppet

You will need -

**Card, Scissors, Tape, Stick
or Straw, Bits and Bobs**

- 1. Design and draw your puppet onto card, black is best but you can use any card.**
- 2. Carefully cut your puppet out.**
- 3. Stick your straw or Stick securely onto the back with tape.**

Top Tip - add colour by cutting a hole inside the silhouette and sticking coloured tissue or cellophane on the back.

Top Tip - Make a moving shadow by cutting a separate part, punching a hole in it and attaching with a split pin or food bag tie.

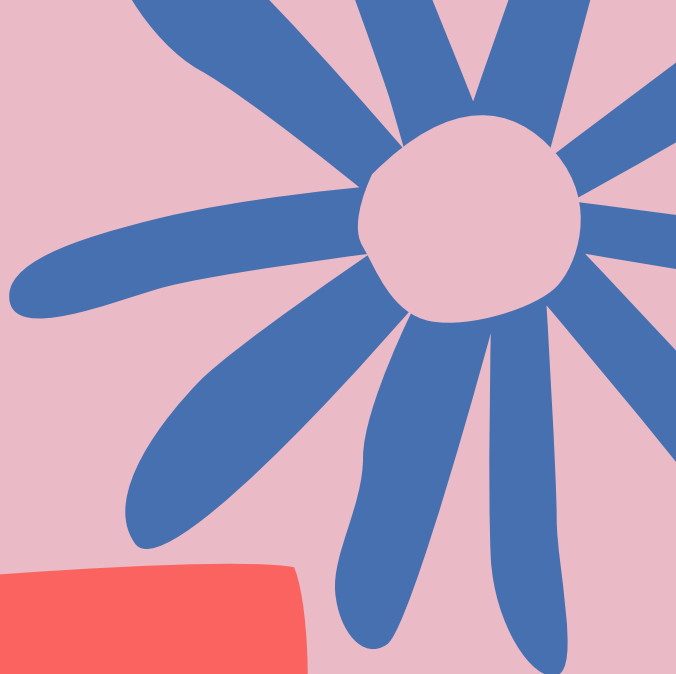
Hold your puppet in front of a torch or desk light in a dark room.

Try making a shadow screen from a box, cut out the back and front and stick thin paper to one side
